Dear Parents and Carers,

### **Nursery Class Bubble Closure**

**We have received notification that a child/adult in the Nursery Class has tested positive for Covid-19.**

Having taken advice from Public Health England (PHE) and Sefton Council, and in line with national guidance, the Nursery Class Bubble will now be forced to close. This means that all the Nursery Class children must be collected from school as soon as possible and stay at home until Thursday, 22<sup>nd</sup> October and self-isolate. You are being asked to follow this guidance to reduce the spread of Covid-19 to others in the community. If your child is well at the end of the 14 day period of self-isolation, then they can return to usual activities. A negative test does not mean that your child can return to school earlier than 14 days – please do not request a test unless symptoms are displayed. Other members of your household can continue normal activities provided your child does not develop symptoms.

### **What if my child develops symptoms?**

If your child develops symptoms of Covid-19 whilst they are self-isolating, they should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared as advised. Please also inform school as soon as possible.


All other household member who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill. Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home. Household members staying at home for 14 dates will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community.
